ENGINEERING UPDATE

Boiler work on Arthur is continuing with cracking to the foundation ring having been welded; the ring is about to be refitted. The new lower side sheets and throat plate will then be fitted. Work on the frames and motion is also ongoing. The hope is to have the loco re-wheeled by Christmas and to be running as Thomas next year.

The 165 diesel has now been started for the first time since its engine has been reassembled and should be back in service shortly. Some work is needed on the motion on 66 and we hope to do this in November.

The second TPO coach has now been moved into the up-yard shed and will be repainted over the next couple of months.
