### **NEW POINT CONNECTION**

The new point connection from the yard has been completed. This allows us to keep the mark 1 coaches in the yard (rather than 1/4 mile away at the end of the track) which is easier for maintenance and also means the guard can easily check the coaches in the morning before an open day.

### **ARTHUR UPDATE**

Our engineering department has been busy working on 'Arthur' this month. Our boiler contractor Alex Beasley has fitted the new washout plugs. The mounting bosses have been blanked off and the overhauled pressure gauge has been fitted ready for the hydraulic testing in December. The studs for the boiler fittings have been fitted. New gauge frames, safety valves and whistle valves have been ordered. The regulator and main steam pipe assembly is being overhauled by an external contractor. Alex has also been annealing the ends of the tubes ready to be fitted before Christmas. A few of the fire box tube holes have been bushed back to their original size reading for tubing. The studs for the brick arch have all been fitted.

The original axleboxes have had new bronze horn liners with bronze shear screws fitted. The axlebox crowns have all been whitemetalled and are ready to be fitted into the axleboxes. New eccentric sheaves have been cast in iron as the old ones were worn out (photo top right). Running boards have been rivetted onto the frames and the welds have been ground off (photo bottom right: volunteer Max Walshe).

#### TPO UPDATE:

After the reopening of the newly repainted Travelling Post Office (TPO) coaches earlier in the year, we have had further good fortune in the form of a generous donation from the Winchcombe Railway Museum. This comprises a set of TPO lineside exchange apparatus. This equipment was used until 1971 to deliver pouches containing mail bags to passing TPO trains without the need for the train to stop, while at the same time collecting pouches of sorted mail from the train. With help from others within the QRS community, we collected the apparatus from Winchcombe. After a lifetime spent outside, it now needs some restoration work. Parks & Gardens have kindly made space for the equipment in their Romney, which will enable us to work on it under cover, before it is set up as an addition to

our TPO display.

We ended our season with a new venture for us, a Christmas lunch in the Oxford Room, which was attended by the whole group, in some cases together with significant others. The meal, provided by Jilly, proved to be an absolute feast, and we are very grateful to her for this, and to the two colleagues who served the meal to us. Roland Gillott
