ARRIVAL & VISITOR CENTRE

The centre's address is Station Road, Quainton HP22 4BY. Our main car park is open on a school day, simply follow the signs. We recommend that coaches park on the righthand side, parallel to the Visitor Centre. On busier days, some coaches may need to park at the rear of the main section of the car park.



You will be met by one of our volunteers and, when your group are all together, taken into the Visitor Centre, which will be your base except on busier days. Large groups will be based on the Visitor Centre platform and smaller groups in the café, function room or cinema coach.

There will be a short safety briefing and an introduction to your volunteer guide, who will stay with you, as well as an opportunity to use the toilets. Most of the site is level or ramped access, including the Visitor Centre, museum, Education Coach and engine sheds although, unfortunately, the miniature railway is not wheelchair accessible. We will be happy to offer any assistance that we can, so if you have any queries, please let someone at the centre know prior to your arrival.

YOUR BASE FOR THE DAY

Packed lunches, coats etc. can be left in your area except on very busy days or when the Centre is open to visitors, when personal effects and lunches may need to remain on your coach. Your base will be where your group eat lunch, although there are picnic facilities available outside in good weather.

Lunch can be arranged at a time to suit you and we recommend that we stop at your school's usual lunch time. We may ask for some flexibility on particularly busy days, but this will be discussed on the day. Your guide will also confirm your departure time with you, to make sure that you are away on time.

Toilets are available in the Visitor Centre and elsewhere (see next section).

MAIN ACTIVITIES

Toilets are available at the locations indicated (T). There is a sample itinerary below, but your guide will have an exact route on the day. Please note these activities may be dependent on weather, volunteer availability and other factors.

Train Ride

Everyone's favourite! Running from either Platform 4 or Platform 3, a ride behind a real steam engine in our heritage railway coaches along our 1/3rd mile route through the Buckinghamshire countryside.

Miniature Train

Our 12-inch gauge, ride-on miniature train features lovely views, familiar characters, a deadly crocodile and a spooky tunnel. Run by the Vale of Aylesbury Model Engineering Society. (T)

Up Yard & Shed

A chance to get up close to some of the stars of our show in the shed as well as our more special residents: the giant South African engine, a London Underground train and the explosive Gunpowder Van.

Quinton Road Station

The original Victorian station building stood alongside the old Metropolitan Railway, still a working freight line, along with the original cattle dock, weighbridge and Brill Tramway shelter. (T- busy days only)

Rewley Road Visitor Centre

As well as being the base for our school visits, our Visitor Centre is the former Oxford Rewley Road Station which was moved from its original home to Quainton. Inside are coaches from Queen Victoria's Royal Train, a coach used by Churchill and Eisenhower to plan D-Day and our newest addition 'Cornwall', a single-wheeled Victorian steam engine from the National Railway Museum. Our Visitor Centre also houses our café and gift shop. (T)

Down Yard & Shed

The Down Shed is where most of our restoration and repair work is done as well as housing some of our oldest working steam engines. If you are lucky, you may be able to see some on the move.

Museum

Our award-winning museum could be an entire day's visit on its own. The history of railways, from horses and the Rocket, are covered; rare and special exhibits will be pointed out by your guide; the Small Exhibits room shows some surprising artefacts in detail; a chance to walk through wagons, brake vans and a steam engine cab.

EDUCATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

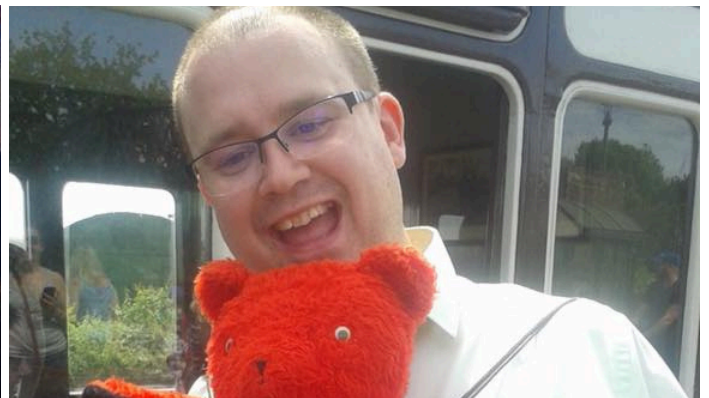
